#### Carnforth braves the weather to remember our heroes!

On a very wet morning, an estimated 1,000 people lined the Carnforth Remembrance Parade along Market Street, North Road and New Street and at the War Memorial, to remember the Service men and women who served our country in all Wars and conflicts across the world! Of course, this year had a special significance being 100 years since the end of the First World War.

The parade was led by a Piper, followed by Standard bearers; the Town Mayor and Councillors; Church Leaders; Servicemen and cadets from the Navy, Army and Air Force; the Police and Fire and Rescue Service; a range of local youth organisations and community groups and members of the public – it was an amazing sight!

At the War Memorial, the Service was once again led by Reverend Neale and included poignant readings, blessings and hymns as well as *Flowers of the Forest* played by the Piper and a Bugler sounding the *Last Post* and *Reveille*.

Following a moving reading of *For the Fallen* and the names of our local War heroes, an unprecedented 38 dignitaries, Services and local organisations laid Wreaths and saluted or bowed their heads in respect. The full parade then reconvened and marched up Market Street to the Civic Hall on North Road where a Reception, open to the public, was held.

The town was proud to be joining millions across the nation. To our brave servicemen and women, we thank you

for your sacrifice and nothing we do or say will ever be enough, but we hope that our Remembrance Day Parade and Service showed our gratitude.


## The Men on the Monument: The Carnforth Poppy Trail

#### Message from our twin town of Sailly sur la Lys in France

Dear friends in Carnforth, today, France is commemorating the 100th anniversary of the armistice of 11 November 1918. There isn't a town, there isn't a village in France which doesn't keep engraved in the stone of a monument, or in the minds of its people, the memory of the heroism of a young generation, blighted and decimated by 52 months of murderous fighting.

Today, in front of our memorials, in Sailly as in Carnforth, we share the memory of the victims of this terrible war. We stand together with our friends in Carnforth, as with many other nations who are involved in this commemoration to honour our fighting men from Sailly and from Carnforth

We cannot forget the courage and the sacrifice of our brave sons who fell on the field of battle, as well as the British soldiers, especially those from Carnforth who came to fight, and died on our soil. All the young men and women who came from all over the world, whether they were European, African, American, from Asia or from Australasia, fought for an ideal of peace of liberty and fraternity.

On this day of commemoration, we appeal to everyone, to remember the supreme sacrifice and the hope that lived in the hearts of the fallen, to inspire our future actions, in favour of that peace, that liberty and that fraternity.

#### Carnforth Community Emergency Plan



The last few winters have seen unprecedented rainfall events. These storms have given rise to widespread flooding, loss of power, damage to property and disruption of transport. Carnforth has not escaped these impacts, but we are now in a much better position to respond. As winter approaches this is a good time to provide you with an update on the **Carnforth Community Emergency Plan.** 

The Town Council has been working closely with Lancaster City Council to develop its Community Emergency plan and here are a few details about how the plan will work in practice.

The Emergency Plan will only be triggered in the case of severe and widespread impacts such as large-scale power loss in Carnforth. Under such circumstances the Civic Hall will be opened to provide a safe, warm and lit refuge for anyone who wants to use it. The hall will also be made available to the emergency services.

We now have emergency power in the hall which means that, even if power supply to Carnforth is lost, we can light and heat the hall. We can also provide hot drinks. Limited phone charging facilities may be available where the use of a phone is deemed to be critical but please ensure you keep your phones charged throughout the winter period.

How will you know that the Emergency Plan has been triggered? In the event of an emergency normal forms of communication are likely to be disrupted – however, we will seek to inform you by Twitter (@CarnforthTC), Facebook

(www.facebook.com/carnforthtowncouncil/) and on our website

(<u>www.carnforthtowncouncil.org</u>). If the Civic Hall is opened, we will also leave a message on the Civic Hall Emergency number - **07849-746692** [this number will only be answered where the Emergency Plan is triggered and is not be used for any other purpose].

**Be Winter Ready:** While your Town Council is working hard to provide support, winter readiness is everyone's responsibility. One way of preparing is to consider what items you may need in an emergency and here is a short list of things you may want to consider.

- ✓ First aid kit and medication;
- ✓ Copies of important family documents in a waterproof bag;
- ✓ Prescription medication;
- ✓ Cash and Credit Cards;
- ✓ Car Keys;
- ✓ Toiletries and sanitary supplies;
- ✓ Mobile phone and charger;
- ✓ Infant supplies;
- ✓ Spare clothes;
- ✓ A battery torch with spare batteries or a wind-up torch;
- ✓ A battery radio with spare batteries or wind up radio;
- ✓ Bottled water and emergency food;
- ✓ Childcare supplies or other special care items;
- ✓ Extra set of house and car keys.

An Emergency Grab Bag in your car is also extremely important during cold weather which should include -

- ✓ Suitable winter clothes and a blanket or a sleeping bag
- ✓ Mobile phone, torch, radio and extra batteries
- ✓ Shovel and windscreen scraper

Please also consider other vulnerable people in our community. Check on friends, relatives and neighbours who may be at risk in the event of an emergency. **Councillor Chris Smith**

Thank you to those members of the public who attended the recent Neighbourhood Plan Information evening at the Civic Hall. The good attendance clearly shows that residents have a keen interest in our local environment, take great pride in the town and want to have a say in its

development. From the meeting, six members of the public agreed to join the Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group and we have already had our first meeting. The group is very much looking forward to working in partnership with Planning Consultants, Troy Planning & Design (<a href="https://troyplanning.com/neighbourhood-planning/">https://troyplanning.com/neighbourhood-planning/</a>). The company are experienced in neighbourhood planning and have been appointed to help us to produce a plan that, whilst complementing the Lancaster District Local Plan, will deliver on the *Values*, *Vision and Objectives* agreed with our residents and, crucially, give the people of Carnforth a say in how the town is shaped in the future.

The next step for the group is to apply for Government funds that will be used to identify and collect evidence to justify our policies and develop a plan that reflects the vision and objectives of our local community. The group will consult and engage with our communities throughout the process and ensure that it is inclusive, meaningful and well-documented. #### **Carnforth Community Swimming**

**Pool News:** We are entering the tenth month of operation since transfer from the County Council, and are pleased to report that sixteen schools and school groups use the Pool, along with the general public

and others hiring for specific parties and dive training.

There has been massive and very welcome support from the local community that's essential to keep the Pool open, and the Friends Group is becoming well established.

Income will hopefully be close to running costs through the first year, and with greater pool use and income becoming possible, as staffing levels are progressively increased through into 2019.

Repairs, improvements and upgrading is however necessary for plant and equipment to be reliable and energy efficient, along with making certain areas more attractive - which cannot come from income, so grant funding is a very welcome source of funding. We have just received a grant for a massive Pool inflatable and the Christmas shutdown 21st December to the 6th of January, will be utilised to replace the partition between the Visitor area and Pool, predominantly for better heat retention and to reduce gas heating costs.

The disabled shower room and other toilet facilities are also to be upgraded under the same funding before the end of March 2019 - so definitely becoming the place to work and swim. Please visit our web site for more information <a href="https://www.carnforth.org">www.carnforth.org</a>
