Draft Minutes of the meeting held on Monday 3rd October 2022

Apologies: Apologies were received and accepted from Councillors Smith and Stretch
 Declaration on interests and dispensations: There were no declarations of interest or requests for dispensation on items on the agenda.
 Urgent Business: There were no matters of Urgent Business
 Minutes: The was RESOLVED that the Minutes of the meeting held on Monday 5th September be accepted. The Town Clerk provided a brief update on the latest position on the proposed 'Warm & Welcoming Places' initiative.

Councillors considered each of the above planning application and it was **RESOLVED that**Carnforth Town Council considers for approval the recommendations of the Town

Development & Planning Committee.

22094 Town Development: The committee considered the following events, updates and opportunities:

1) **Great Big Green Week – 24th September to 2nd October 2022**: Given the relatively short time to plan and deliver the Carnforth Great Big Green Day (24th September) was considered to be a success, with a variety of contributors providing a range of useful information relating to tackling climate change and protecting our environment. It had been a good opportunity for organisations to network and whilst numbers attending had not been particularly high, it was agreed that the event could be built on for next year and beyond.

It was pleasing to see children from Carnforth Community School, Christ Church School and Our Lady of Lourdes School, join volunteers from Carnforth Rotary and Councillors to carry out litter picking and weeding. ACTION: Town Clerk to include The Great Big Green Week in 2023 Calendar of events and 'generic banners' to be used to advertise Carnforth Town Council events be designed and costed

2) Remembrance Sunday – 13th November 2022: Mr Ian Laurence and the Town Clerk provided an update on plans for the Remembrance Sunday Parade and Service. It was reported that following the intervention of the Lancashire Constabulary Road Traffic Partnership it had been necessary, following approval under designated powers, to engage the traffic management services of Ventbrook Ltd, supported by volunteers.

ACTION: Town Clerk and Mr Laurence continue to take necessary actions to deliver the Remembrance Day commemorations. Councillor Watkins will plan a short Service for Armistice Day (11th November)

3) **Co-wheels scheme:** The Town Clerk was pleased to report that the scheme has moved forward in recent weeks. The electric vehicle charging point is established and signage in place; Carnforth Town Council have signed up with bpPulse and funding the standing charges and customers are now able to formally sign up to the scheme and enjoy a £40 credit. It was reported that take-up at the Great Big Green Day for the scheme had been good and it is generating interest on social media.

The vehicle to be based in Carnforth is now expected in week commencing 17th October. It was then **RESOLVED that the town development updates be noted and that progress on actions be reported back in due course**

22095 Public Highways & Open Spaces: The committee considered the following matters:

1) **Scotland Road closure:** There was a discussion on the current road closure on Scotland Road to install gas and water mains and sewerage pipes relating to the Rowland Homes development.

It was reported that the whilst there had been some disruption at peak times traffic had largely flowed well. It was reported that the traffic management arrangements had been enhanced through Lancashire County Council's engagement with the Town Council and the Carnforth Chamber of Trade before and during the works.

Following the success of this partnership, Lancashire County Council will continue to engage with us when substantial improvements are made to the highways network as part of the planning approval for the Rowland Homes development.

2) Public Rights of Way; It was reported that the Outdoor Maintenance Officer will install the 'Kissing Gates' at the specified locations at the earliest opportunity and plans to do this before his resignation on 31st October 2022. Installation of the wayleave and finger posts will have to be carried out by his successor.

It was then RESOLVED that the updates and actions be noted and that County Councillor Williamson and Lancashire County Council be thanked for their collaboration with the Town Council and the local community.

Carnforth Neighbourhood Plan (CNP): The Town Clerk reported that the Examiner's draft 22096 on the Carnforth Neighbourhood Plan had been received. The report concluded that, subject to modifications recommended by the Examiner, the CNP could progress to the final stage of the process, namely a local Referendum to be arranged and funded by Lancaster City Council. Councillors were advised that the Carnforth Neighbourhood Working Group had agreed to the Examiners suggested modifications in full as they enhance the format and content of the CNP, whilst providing substantial assurance that the plan meet all UK and European legislation and provides a solid blueprint for Carnforth over the next 10 years and beyond.

It was noted that the CNP is the most substantial in terms of designated area, policies and aspirations in the Lancaster District to date. Subject to the Neighbourhood Plan being adopted, Carnforth Town Council will be responsible for taking the lead on resourcing, monitoring, reviewing and implementing it over the coming years and will need to build this into its strategic and budgeting plans for years to come.

After some comments, it was **RESOLVED** that the update be noted and that Carnforth Town Council congratulates the Carnforth Neighbourhood Plan Working Group on its achievement in delivering this fundamental plan for the future of the Town.
